

COURSE OVERVIEW

This is a Zero to Three Accredited Training. The DC:0-5 Classification system is a systematic way of conceptualizing the multilayered complexity of infants and young children in the contexts of their physical health, psychosocial stressors, relationships, and developmental competence. It provides an internationally accepted approach to thinking fully about infants, young children, and their families as we communicate with other practitioners. The DC:0-5 classification system, offers a multi-axial approach to diagnosis, which is developmentally informed, relationship-based, and contextually and culturally grounded. The training will teach the contents of each axis, including Axis I: Clinical Disorders. The training is designed for family practitioners, mental health clinicians, pediatricians and psychiatrists, whose work with infants, young children, and their families involves assessment, diagnosis, and case formulation and therapeutic interventions.
